
REMEMBRANCE OF BAPTISM







Benjamin Joshua Whittier was born on August 9, 2000, in Redlands, CA. He was called to his Heavenly home on September 5, 2020. Ben was hiking with his friends at Joshua Tree and was overcome by the heat. Ben was baptized by Pastor Don Wiley on December 10, 2000 at St. John in Colton. On September 26, 2010, Ben was confirmed by Pastor Don Wiley in Colton. Ben was an acolyte, a book bearer, and a crucifier in our Divine Service.

Ben attended St. John Preschool, Packinghouse Christian Academy, Arrowhead Christian Academy, Redlands East Valley High School and most recently San Diego State University (SDSU). Academically Ben did well and he was undecided about a career choice. Last year, he joined Alpha Phi Omega, a co-ed community service fraternity. Their principles included leadership, friendship and service. In August 2020, Ben began his third year at SDSU and was hired to be a peer educator for Aztecs Reaching Aztecs which is a part of the Counseling and Psychological Services offered at the university. The program helps students enrich their college experience by making connections with other students. Ben also worked part-time at the YMCA in Redlands during his summer and winter breaks from school. He worked as a life guard and as support staff with the kids and other staff at Camp Edwards.

While growing up, Ben participated in T-ball, basketball, soccer, cross country, and 3 years of water polo while in high school. Ben enjoyed reading, writing, listening to music, video games and playing his saxophone. Ben became scuba certified when he was ten years old and enjoyed numerous dives with his dad in Florida. Many summers were spent with his dad in Montana, Utah and Florida where they fished, camped, kayaked, rappelled and competed in shooting competitions over the years. Ben shot a .22 and a 9mm handgun and was becoming quite competitive in the ranks. Ben was also a very good fly fisherman.

Family and friends will remember his smile, humor and thoughtfulness. He is survived by his mom, dad, two grandmothers, one grandfather, aunts, uncles, and many cousins.
