



C: **Thanks be to God.**



Marianne grew up in the small farming town of Zimmerman, Minnesota, to Walter and Mathilda Goldenman, where she enjoyed growing up with her sister Evelyn and helping out at their parents' truck stop café. Marianne was educated in a two room school house and met her husband, Art, in the trumpet section of the band at the young age of fifteen. She received her bachelor's degree at Macalester College in St. Paul and completed her nursing education at Abbott Northwestern Hospital in Minneapolis. She arrived to Redlands in 1969 and since then, had devoted her life to a variety of different activities and causes that were close to her heart.

Marianne's life revolved around helping others, especially her "Church Family" at Christ the King Lutheran Church. Her charity inspired all of her actions – she was active in many volunteer roles, including Assistance League, where she spearheaded many community programs, and Family Service, where she enjoyed helping parents pick out Christmas gifts for their children and filling the food pantry. Marianne was an accomplished and passionate seamstress, learning to sew as a young girl in 4H, and won several awards at the county and state level. She could sew anything – an intricate wedding dress, her one-of-a-kind costumes for her girls' dance recitals, school bags for mission work, and she personally designed church banners. There was truly nothing that could stop her! As a mom, she was loving, loyal, supportive, and determined that her girls would reach their full potential with hands-on dedication on her part. She enjoyed every part of being a grandma and had a great deal of pride that she was able to see all six of her grandchildren graduate high school, a goal that was very important to her. Surely upon her arrival to eternal life she heard the words:

"Well done, my good and faithful servant!" – Matthew 25:23.
