RECEIVING THE LORD'S SUPPER AT CHRIST THE KING

As intended by Christ and as practiced by the one, holy, catholic and apostolic church throughout her history, "Closed Communion" is observed in this congregation, in which the Lord's Supper is distributed only to those:

- A) who have been **baptized** in the name of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit;
- B) who have been **instructed** in the truth of Holy Scripture as taught in the **Lutheran Confessions**, who have been **confirmed** in this Lutheran Faith, and who **now confess** the same doctrine that is taught in this congregation, holding membership in a congregation of the **Lutheran Church – Missouri Synod**;
- C) who believe that in this sacrament the **real body and blood** of Christ are truly distributed to them and **orally received** by them, bestowing on them the **forgiveness of sins, life and salvation**;
- D) who **sincerely repent** of all their sins, and **desire to receive** God's forgiveness in this holy meal.

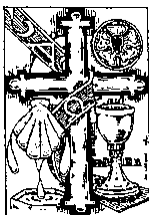


HARVEST FESTIVAL FRIDAY, OCTOBER 22, AT 6PM-8PM

KIDS IN THE DIVINE SERVICE



What are “ceremonies”?

The word “ceremony” comes from the Latin word that means “ritual.” Ceremonies are the actions associated with the words we use in worship. For example, when the Pastor says “In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit” you may see people making the sign of the cross. Making the sign of the cross is a ceremony. Can you think of other ceremonies that occur during the Divine Service?

Why do we have ceremonies?

Ceremonies help to keep things reverent and in good order during worship, but **their main purpose is to teach the faith through sight, sound and action.** For example, when we make the sign of the cross, we are reminded of our Baptism. At your Baptism, you received the sign of the cross on your forehead and on your heart to mark you as one redeemed by Christ the crucified! Ceremonies also show what a congregation believes. You can learn a lot about a church by the ceremonies in their worship.



Parents: The Lutheran Confessions say: “The purpose of observing ceremonies is that men may learn the Scriptures,” and “the chief purpose of all ceremonies is to teach the people what they need to know about Christ.” If you have questions about the ceremonies of your church, ask your pastor. He will be happy to explain them!



THE READINGS



AMOS 5:6-7, 10-15

⁶ Seek the LORD and live,
lest he break out like fire in the
house of Joseph,
and it devour, with none to quench it
for Bethel,
⁷ O you who turn justice to wormwood
and cast down righteousness to the
earth!...

¹⁰ They hate him who reproves in the gate,
and they abhor him who speaks the
truth.

¹¹ Therefore because you trample on the
poor
and you exact taxes of grain from
him,
you have built houses of hewn stone,
but you shall not dwell in them;
you have planted pleasant vineyards,
but you shall not drink their wine.

¹² For I know how many are your
transgressions
and how great are your sins—
you who afflict the righteous, who take
a bribe,
and turn aside the needy in the gate.

¹³ Therefore he who is prudent will keep
silent in such a time,
for it is an evil time.

¹⁴ Seek good, and not evil,
that you may live;
and so the LORD, the God of hosts, will
be with you,
as you have said.

¹⁵ Hate evil, and love good,
and establish justice in the gate;
it may be that the LORD, the God of
hosts,
will be gracious to the remnant of
Joseph.

HEBREWS 3:12-19

¹²Take care, brothers, lest there be in any of
you an evil, unbelieving heart, leading you
to fall away from the living God. ¹³But
exhort one another every day, as long as it is
called "today," that none of you may be
hardened by the deceitfulness of sin. ¹⁴For
we share in Christ, if indeed we hold our
original confidence firm to the end. ¹⁵As it is
said,

"Today, if you hear his voice,
do not harden your hearts as in the
rebellion."

¹⁶For who were those who heard and yet
rebelled? Was it not all those who left Egypt
led by Moses? ¹⁷And with whom was he
provoked for forty years? Was it not with
those who sinned, whose bodies fell in the
wilderness? ¹⁸And to whom did he swear

that they would not enter his rest, but to those who were disobedient? ¹⁹So we see

that they were unable to enter because of unbelief.

MARK 10:17-22

¹⁷As [Jesus] was setting out on his journey, a man ran up and knelt before him and asked him, "Good Teacher, what must I do to inherit eternal life?" ¹⁸And Jesus said to him, "Why do you call me good? No one is good except God alone. ¹⁹You know the commandments: 'Do not murder, Do not commit adultery, Do not steal, Do not bear false witness, Do not defraud, Honor your

father and mother.'" ²⁰And he said to him, "Teacher, all these I have kept from my youth." ²¹And Jesus, looking at him, loved him, and said to him, "You lack one thing: go, sell all that you have and give to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven; and come, follow me." ²²Disheartened by the saying, he went away sorrowful, for he had great possessions.

TWENTY-FIRST SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

Christ Jesus Is the One and Only Good by Whom You Inherit Eternal Life

The Lord is the Author and Giver of life, as well as a consuming fire of judgment against all *"who afflict the righteous, who take a bribe, and turn aside the needy in the gate"* (Amos 5:12). *"Seek the LORD and live,"* therefore, by hating what is evil, loving what is good and doing what is just and right, according to His Word. *"And so the LORD, the God of hosts, will be with you"* (Amos 5:6, 14–15). Understand that *"no one is good except God alone"* (Mark 10:18). The life that you are called to live is found neither in your *"great possessions,"* nor in your good works, but only in Christ Jesus. Let go of *"all that you have"* and follow Him, even unto death, and *"you will have treasure in heaven"* (Mark 10:21–22). Do not harden your heart against His voice, nor turn away from Him, lest you *"fall away from the living God."* Rather, hear and heed His call, cling to His Word and *"exhort one another every day,"* that you may remain steadfast in Christ and *"firm to the end"* (Heb. 3:12–15).
