Christ the King Lutheran Preschool is a wonder. Born of hope in 1980, ours is an incredibly fruitful and vibrant center for learning. While this juggernaut of Christian education has evolved into the colossal force of grace and beauty that she is now, one thing has been consistent from the jump: devoted women have served both the Lord and God's children with humility, professionalism, and joy.

Presently, our preschool harbors approximately 235 little ones every week in our fourteen classrooms. Add to that astounding number an additional 90 children who are collected from their elementary schools and brought to our campus for after-school care. Our reputation around town is exemplary. Our graduates litter the landscape of the Inland Empire. A young whippersnapper came in to repair our fire alarm panel in room 5 and he told me that he was a preschooler here 20 years ago; loved it. The outfit that reroofed our church and parish hall wings, the owner's son who now works with his old man, he told me that he had the time of his life going to school here. The patch of ground at the corner of Ford and South Streets is anchored in the hearts of so many. God has smiled on this place and the impact on the lives of children is life-long.

In its 42-year history, there have been only four directors. Linda Allen was the first, followed by Terry Herrle, Cathy Standley, and our own Christine Chernobieff. It started with only two classrooms and just a handful of children. "Let the little children come to me and do not hinder them, for to such belongs the kingdom of heaven" (Matthew 19:14). In Praise of our School

Christ the King Lutheran Preschool is a wonder. Born of hope in 1980, ours is an incredibly fruitful and vibrant center for learning. Who benefits from such a well-run machine? The children! How delightful it is to know that our school is elevating the hearts and minds of youngsters with God's Word, with a clear and perceptible Christian outlook on life, and with the beautiful simplicity of teaching timeless truths to Christ's "little ones." The Kingdom truly belongs to such as these.

Christine is stepping down as director of our beloved school. Her husband, Michael, has found a very good position with a company in Tennessee and is already gainfully employed there. God has opened numerous doors for the Chernobieff family in regard to a new home and all the other critical elements to making this transition a success. To be sure, we will miss her. Christine's contribution to our school is, humanly speaking, second to none. Her grasp of the core ministry of a school, her clarity of thought in leading us to realize our potential as a school, her constant awareness of how educational concepts are growing, and her demeanor as a leader have all aided us immeasurably. She managed a building project and a pandemic with balance and courage. Well done, good and faithful servant.

Sheri is to be our new director. Rare is the individual who first steps into such a position so well prepared to succeed. Her level of experience is matched by the depth of her Christian faith. Christ the King is blessed to have Sheri fill the void that will be left with Christine's departure (in June). There will be time to kick Christine in the shins. In Praise of our School

Christ the King Lutheran Preschool is a wonder. Born of hope in 1980, ours is an incredibly fruitful and vibrant center for learning. Christ the King Lutheran Preschool is a wonder. Born of hope in 1980, ours is an incredibly fruitful and vibrant center for learning. Christ the King Lutheran Preschool is a wonder. Born of hope in 1980, ours is an incredibly fruitful and vibrant center for learning. In Praise of our School

Christ the King Lutheran Preschool is a wonder. Born of hope in 1980, ours is an incredibly fruitful and vibrant center for learning. While this juggernaut of Christian education has evolved into the colossal force of grace and beauty that she is now, one thing has been consistent from the jump: devoted women have served both the Lord and God's children with humility, professionalism, and joy.

Presently, our preschool harbors approximately 235 little ones every week in our fourteen classrooms. Add to that astounding number an additional 90 children who are collected from their elementary schools and brought to our campus for after-school care. Our reputation around town is exemplary. Our graduates litter the landscape of the Inland Empire. A young whippersnapper came in to repair our fire alarm panel in room 5 and he told me that he was a preschooler here 20 years ago; loved it. The outfit that reroofed our church and parish hall wings, the owner's son who now works with his old man, he told me that he had the time of his life going to school here. The patch of ground at the corner of Ford and South Streets is anchored in the hearts of so many. God has smiled on this place and the impact on the lives of children is life-long.

In its 42-year history, there have been only four directors. Linda Allen was the first, followed by Terry Herrle, Cathy Standley, and our own Christine Chernobieff. It started with only two classrooms and just a handful of children. "Let the little children come to me and do not hinder them, for to such belongs the kingdom of heaven" (Matthew 19:14). Our Lord's words are central to our Lutheran sensibilities regarding education and they are foremost in the minds of the stellar women who serve in this place. There is something magnificently wholesome about our school. Working in this place is not a cakewalk. Children bring a certain challenge to one's day. A strong spirit, a prepared mind, a versatile teaching style, and a kind heart are all tremendous assets for our teachers. Organizing this moving jig-saw puzzle is even more of an administrative trial. The wealth of experience that two unique individuals have accumulated has taught our director and assistant director how to anticipate problems, how to account for genuine solutions ahead of time, and how to do so with a chipper attitude.

Both Christine Chernobieff and Sheri Genaway-Coe predate me as servants of Christ the King! At a critical juncture, they both assumed positions of leadership in our blessed school and God has used their unique talents to great effect. A school such as ours, with its large staff and abundance of children, can be a wild and wooly creature but these two smooth its rough edges and clockwork is the result. Who benefits from such a well-run machine? The children! How delightful it is to know that our school is elevating the hearts and minds of youngsters with God's Word, with a clear and perceptible Christian outlook on life, and with the beautiful simplicity of teaching timeless truths to Christ's "little ones." The Kingdom truly belongs to such as these.

Christine is stepping down as director of our beloved school. Her husband, Michael, has found a very good position with a company in Tennessee and is already gainfully employed there. God has opened numerous doors for the Chernobieff family in regard to a new home and all the other critical elements to making this transition a success. To be sure, we will miss her. Christine's contribution to our school is, humanly speaking, second to none. Her grasp of the core ministry of a school, her clarity of thought in leading us to realize our potential as a school, her constant awareness of how educational concepts are growing, and her demeanor as a leader have all aided us immeasurably. She managed a building project and a pandemic with balance and courage. Well done, good and faithful servant.

Sheri is to be our new director. Rare is the individual who first steps into such a position so well prepared to succeed. Her level of experience is matched by the depth of her Christian faith. Christ the King is blessed to have Sheri fill the void that will be left with Christine's departure (in June). There will be time to kick Christine in the shins. We will send her off with a suitable fete. In the meantime, take in the full view of our school. Thank God for the work of the women who give of themselves so generously in this place. May the Lord of heaven and earth continue to bless our school with His favor.

Dearly beloved of Christ the King,

In Praise of our School

Christ the King Lutheran Preschool is a wonder. Born of hope in 1980, ours is an incredibly fruitful and vibrant center for learning. While this juggernaut of Christian education has evolved into the colossal force of grace and beauty that she is now, one thing has been consistent from the jump: devoted women have served both the Lord and God's children with humility, professionalism, and joy.

Presently, our preschool harbors approximately 235 little ones every week in our fourteen classrooms. Add to that astounding number an additional 90 children who are collected from their elementary schools and brought to our campus for after-school care. Our reputation around town is exemplary. Our graduates litter the landscape of the Inland Empire. A young whippersnapper came in to repair our fire alarm panel in room 5 and he told me that he was a preschooler here 20 years ago; loved it. The outfit that reroofed our church and parish hall wings, the owner's son who now works with his old man, he told me that he had the time of his life going to school here. The patch of ground at the corner of Ford and South Streets is anchored in the hearts of so many. God has smiled on this place and the impact on the lives of children is life-long.

In its 42-year history, there have been only four directors. Linda Allen was the first, followed by Terry Herrle, Cathy Standley, and our own Christine Chernobieff. It started with only two classrooms and just a handful of children. "Let the little children come to me and do not hinder them, for to such belongs the kingdom of heaven" (Matthew 19:14). Our Lord's words are central to our Lutheran sensibilities regarding education and they are foremost in the minds of the stellar women who serve in this place. There is something magnificently wholesome about our school. Working in this place is not a cakewalk. Children bring a certain challenge to one's day. A strong spirit, a prepared mind, a versatile teaching style, and a kind heart are all tremendous assets for our teachers. Organizing this moving jig-saw puzzle is even more of an administrative trial. The wealth of experience that two unique individuals have accumulated has taught our director and assistant director how to anticipate problems, how to account for genuine solutions ahead of time, and how to do so with a chipper attitude.

Both Christine Chernobieff and Sheri Genaway-Coe predate me as servants of Christ the King! At a critical juncture, they both assumed positions of leadership in our blessed school and God has used their unique talents to great effect. A school such as ours, with its large staff and abundance of children, can be a wild and wooly creature but these two smooth its rough edges and clockwork is the result. Who benefits from such a well-run machine? The children! How delightful it is to know that our school is elevating the hearts and minds of youngsters with God's Word, with a clear and perceptible Christian outlook on life, and with the beautiful simplicity of teaching timeless truths to Christ's "little ones." The Kingdom truly belongs to such as these.

Christine is stepping down as director of our beloved school. Her husband, Michael, has found a very good position with a company in Tennessee and is already gainfully employed there. God has opened numerous doors for the Chernobieff family in regard to a new home and all the other critical elements to making this transition a success. To be sure, we will miss her. Christine's contribution to our school is, humanly speaking, second to none. Her grasp of the core ministry of a school, her clarity of thought in leading us to realize our potential as a school, her constant awareness of how educational concepts are growing, and her demeanor as a leader have all aided us immeasurably. She managed a building project and a pandemic with balance and courage. Well done, good and faithful servant.

Sheri is to be our new director. Rare is the individual who first steps into such a position so well prepared to succeed. Her level of experience is matched by the depth of her Christian faith. Christ the King is blessed to have Sheri fill the void that will be left with Christine's departure (in June). There will be time to kick Christine in the shins. We will send her off with a suitable fete. In the meantime, take in the full view of our school. Thank God for the work of the women who give of themselves so generously in this place. May the Lord of heaven and earth continue to bless our school with His favor.

In Praise of our School

Christ the King Lutheran Preschool is a wonder. Born of hope in 1980, ours is an incredibly fruitful and vibrant center for learning. While this juggernaut of Christian education has evolved into the colossal force of grace and beauty that she is now, one thing has been consistent from the jump: devoted women have served both the Lord and God's children with humility, professionalism, and joy.

Presently, our preschool harbors approximately 235 little ones every week in our fourteen classrooms. At a critical juncture, they both assumed positions of leadership in our blessed school and God has used their unique talents to great effect. A school such as ours, with its large staff and abundance of children, can be a wild and wooly creature but these two smooth its rough edges and clockwork is the result. Who benefits from such a well-run machine? The children! How delightful it is to know that our school is elevating the hearts and minds of youngsters with God's Word, with a clear and perceptible Christian outlook on life, and with the beautiful simplicity of teaching timeless truths to Christ's "little ones." The Kingdom truly belongs to such as these.

Christine is stepping down as director of our beloved school. Her husband, Michael, has found a very good position with a company in Tennessee and is already gainfully employed there. God has opened numerous doors for the Chernobieff family in regard to a new home and all the other critical elements to making this transition a success. To be sure, we will miss her. Christine's contribution to our school is, humanly speaking, second to none. Her grasp of the core ministry of a school, her clarity of thought in leading us to realize our potential as a school, her constant awareness of how educational concepts are growing, and her demeanor as a leader have all aided us immeasurably. She managed a building project and a pandemic with balance and courage. Well done, good and faithful servant.

Sheri is to be our new director. Rare is the individual who first steps into such a position so well prepared to succeed. Her level of experience is matched by the depth of her Christian faith. Christ the King is blessed to have Sheri fill the void that will be left with Christine's departure (in June). There will be time to kick Christine in the shins. We will send her off with a suitable fete. In the meantime, take in the full view of our school. Thank God for the work of the women who give of themselves so generously in this place. May the Lord of heaven and earth continue to bless our school with His favor.

In Praise of our School

How delightful it is to know that our school is elevating the hearts and minds of youngsters with God's Word, with a clear and perceptible Christian outlook on life, and with the beautiful simplicity of teaching timeless truths to Christ's "little ones." The Kingdom truly belongs to such as these.

Christine is stepping down as director of our beloved school. Her husband, Michael, has found a very good position with a company in Tennessee and is already gainfully employed there. God has opened numerous doors for the Chernobieff family in regard to a new home and all the other critical elements to making this transition a success. To be sure, we will miss her. MESSAGE FROM OUR PASTOR

Dearly beloved of Christ the King,
The Lord be with you

In Praise of our School

Christ the King Lutheran Preschool is a wonder. Born of hope in 1980, ours is an incredibly fruitful and vibrant center for learning. While this juggernaut of Christian education has evolved into the colossal force of grace and beauty that she is now, one thing has been consistent from the jump: devoted women have served both the Lord and God's children with humility, professionalism, and joy.

Presently, our preschool harbors approximately 235 little ones every week in our fourteen classrooms. Add to that astounding number an additional 90 children who are collected from their elementary schools and brought to our campus for after-school care. Our reputation around town is exemplary. Our graduates litter the landscape of the Inland Empire. A young whippersnapper came in to repair our fire alarm panel in room 5 and he told me that he was a preschooler here 20 years ago; loved it. The outfit that reroofed our church and parish hall wings, the owner's son who now works with his old man, he told me that he had the time of his life going to school here. The patch of ground at the corner of Ford and South Streets is anchored in the hearts of so many. God has smiled on this place and the impact on the lives of children is life-long.

In its 42-year history, there have been only four directors. Linda Allen was the first, followed by Terry Herrle, Cathy Standley, and our own Christine Chernobieff. It started with only two classrooms and just a handful of children. "Let the little children come to me and do not hinder them, for to such belongs the kingdom of heaven" (Matthew 19:14). Our Lord's words are central to our Lutheran sensibilities regarding education and they are foremost in the minds of the stellar women who serve in this place. There is something magnificently wholesome about our school. Working in this place is not a cakewalk. Children bring a certain challenge to one's day. A strong spirit, a prepared mind, a versatile teaching style, and a kind heart are all tremendous assets for our teachers. Organizing this moving jig-saw puzzle is even more of an administrative trial. The wealth of experience that two unique individuals have accumulated has taught our director and assistant director how to anticipate problems, how to account for genuine solutions ahead of time, and how to do so with a chipper attitude.

Both Christine Chernobieff and Sheri Genaway-Coe predate me as servants of Christ the King! At a critical juncture, they both assumed positions of leadership in our blessed school and God has used their unique talents to great effect. A school such as ours, with its large staff and abundance of children, can be a wild and wooly creature but these two smooth its rough edges and clockwork is the result. Who benefits from such a well-run machine? The children! How delightful it is to know that our school is elevating the hearts and minds of youngsters with God's Word, with a clear and perceptible Christian outlook on life, and with the beautiful simplicity of teaching timeless truths to Christ's "little ones." The Kingdom truly belongs to such as these.

Christine is stepping down as director of our beloved school. Her husband, Michael, has found a very good position with a company in Tennessee and is already gainfully employed there. God has opened numerous doors for the Chernobieff family in regard to a new home and all the other critical elements to making this transition a success. To be sure, we will miss her. Christine's contribution to our school is, humanly speaking, second to none. Her grasp of the core ministry of a school, her clarity of thought in leading us to realize our potential as a school, her constant awareness of how educational concepts are growing, and her demeanor as a leader have all aided us immeasurably. She managed a building project and a pandemic with balance and courage. Well done, good and faithful servant.

Sheri is to be our new director. Rare is the individual who first steps into such a position so well prepared to succeed. Her level of experience is matched by the depth of her Christian faith. Christ the King is blessed to have Sheri fill the void that will be left with Christine's departure (in June). There will be time to kick Christine in the shins. We will send her off with a suitable fete. In the meantime, take in the full view of our school. Thank God for the work of the women who give of themselves so generously in this place. May the Lord of heaven and earth continue to bless our school with His favor.




