RECEIVING THE LORD'S SUPPER AT CHRIST THE KING

As intended by Christ and as practiced by the one, holy, catholic and apostolic church throughout her history, "Closed Communion" is observed in this congregation, in which the Lord's Supper is distributed only to those:

- A) who have been **baptized** in the name of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit;
- B) who have been **instructed** in the truth of Holy Scripture as taught in the **Lutheran Confessions**, who have been **confirmed** in this Lutheran faith, and who **now confess** the same doctrine that is taught in this congregation, holding membership in a congregation of the **Lutheran Church - Missouri Synod**;
- C) who believe that in this sacrament the **real body and blood** of Christ are truly distributed to them and **orally received** by them, bestowing on them the **forgiveness of sins, life and salvation**;
- D) who **sincerely repent** of all their sins, and **desire to receive** God's forgiveness in this holy meal.

THE BEGINNING OF LENT

THE INVOCATION

P: In the name of the Father and of the (✠) Son and of the Holy Spirit.

C: Amen.

THE PASTORAL ADDRESS FOR THE BEGINNING OF LENT

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ: Since early days Christians have observed with great devotion the time of our Lord's passion and resurrection. It became the custom of the Church to prepare for this by a season of penitence and fasting. At first, this season of Lent was observed by those who were preparing for Baptism and First Communion in the Great Vigil of Easter, and by those who were to be restored to the Church's fellowship from which they had become separated through sin. In the course of time, the Church came to realize that, by a careful keeping of these days, all Christians might take to heart the call to repentance and the assurance of forgiveness proclaimed in the Gospel, and so, grow in faith and in devotion to our Lord. I invite you, therefore, in the name of the Church, to the observance of a holy Lent, by self examination and repentance; by prayer, fasting and self-denial; and by reading and meditating on God's Holy Word. Let us pray that our dear Father in heaven, for the sake of His beloved Son and in the power of His Holy Spirit, might richly bless this Lenten season for us that we may come to Easter with glad hearts and keep the feast in sincerity and truth.

We pray:

THE LITANY AND COLLECT FOR THE BEGINNING OF LENT

P: God the Father,

C: **have mercy on us.**

P: God the Son,

C: **have mercy on us.**

P: God the Holy Spirit,

C: **have mercy on us.**

P: From all evil and mischief; from pride, vanity, and hypocrisy; from envy, hatred and malice; and from all evil intent,

C: **Good Lord, deliver us.**

P: From sloth, worldliness and love of money; from hardness of heart and contempt for Thy Holy Word in its Law and in its Gospel,

C: **Good Lord, deliver us.**

P: From sins of body and mind; from the deceits of the world, the flesh, and the devil,

C: **Good Lord, deliver us.**

P: In all times of sorrow; in all times of joy; in the hour of death, and at the day of judgment,
C: Good Lord deliver us.
P: By the mystery of Thy holy incarnation; by Thy birth, childhood and obedience; by Thy baptism, fasting and temptation,
C: Good Lord deliver us.
P: By Thy ministry in word and work; by Thy mighty acts of power; and by Thy preaching of the kingdom.
C: Good Lord deliver us.
P: By Thy agony and trial; by Thy cross and passion; and by Thy precious death and burial,
C: Good Lord deliver us.
P: By Thy mighty resurrection; by Thy glorious ascension; and by Thy sending of the Holy Spirit;
C: Good Lord deliver us.
P: Give us true repentance; forgive us our sins of negligence and ignorance and our deliberate sins; and grant us the grace of Thy Holy Spirit to live our lives according to Thy Holy Word.

(At this point in the Ash Wednesday Confession of Sins, the imposition of ashes on the foreheads of the penitents in the form of a cross occurs as a reminder that we are but weak, sinful, mortal human beings who will return to the dust of the earth and whose only hope of salvation lies not in us but in the perfect life, suffering, death on the cross, and resurrection of the Lord Jesus Christ. All who desire to receive the imposition of ashes may approach the altar rail at this time.)

P: Remember, O Man, that thou art dust, and to dust thou shalt return.
C: Amen!
P: Accomplish in us, O God, the work of Thy salvation,
C: that we may show forth in the world Thy glory in the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ.
P: By the cross and passion of Thy Son, our Lord:
C: bring us, with all Thy saints to the joy of His resurrection.
P: Almighty God, the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, Thou dost not desire the death of sinners, but rather that they may turn from their wickedness and live. Therefore we implore Thee to grant us true repentance and Thy Holy Spirit that those things may please Thee which we do on this day, that the rest of our lives may be pure and holy, and that at the last we may come to Thy eternal joys; through Jesus Christ, our Lord.
C: Amen!

THE GRADUAL (Psalm 51)

P: Have mercy on me, O God, according to your unfailing love;

P: Restore to me the joy of your salvation

C: **and grant me a willing spirit, to sustain me.**

P: Then I will teach transgressors your ways,
C: and sinners will turn back to you.
P: Save me from bloodguilt, O God, the God who saves me,
C: and my tongue will sing of your righteousness.
P: O Lord, open my lips,
C: and my mouth will declare your praise.
P: You do not delight in sacrifice, or I would bring it;
C: you do not take pleasure in burnt offerings.
P: The sacrifices of God are a broken spirit;
C: a broken and contrite heart, O God, you will not despise.
P: In your good pleasure make Zion prosper;
C: build up the walls of Jerusalem.
P: Then there will be righteous sacrifices, whole burnt offerings to delight you;
C: then bulls will be offered on your altar.
ALL: Glory be to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit,
as it was in the beginning, is now, and will be forever. Amen.

THE CONFESSION OF FAITH: THE NICENE CREED
